From the Corner:

Generosity...it's a Jesus thing! by Keith M. Haithcock

People ask me from time to time if I like my job. I really do not see my role as Pastor and Teacher as a job. To me it is a calling, a life-style, a vocation, something I cannot separate myself from. It is who I am. Being a pastor is not about being right, having all the answers, doing all the appropriate things, remembering every person's name (although I try), or sitting on the pedestal that many people want to place me on. Being a pastor is about shepherding people in the faith and helping them find their true passion, abilities, and skills, and to listen for our still speaking God thru patterning their lives after Jesus.

In the New Testament we find the letters of 1 Timothy and 2 Timothy. These letters were written to a local pastor, Timothy. Although Timothy is an exceptional leader, he lives in a time of false teachers and is expected to shepherd his flock with devotion to the teachings of Jesus. This is not an easy vocation and there are always those ready to criticize, accuse you of missing the mark, as well as preaching too long.

One critique of pastors (and Churches in general) is that we are always talking about or asking for money. Have you ever heard that? What is amazing about this critique is that those raising this complaint are not just those who are outside of the church, but rather those of us in the Jesus movement.

The topic of money, the realities of having it and how we use it, is a major theme of Jesus' teachings. Except for his focus on the coming Realm of God, Jesus has more to say about money than any other topic. It would surprise some people to know that Jesus spoke more about money and economic justice than love. Specifically, he taught that money is not the root of all evil, but the love of money is. This tells me that he truly knows and understands our hearts, and that he cares about how we use our time and talents, as well as financial resources.

It has been my experience that most of us in this country do not think of ourselves as rich. But all it takes is to place ourselves in what we may call a poor country or oppressed neighborhood to realize our wealth. It has also surprised me that studies show that the highest percentage of donations given to charities come from those with the lowest incomes.

Generosity with our resources is a spiritual practice – something that is part of our daily living, an act of worship, a response to God's amazing grace, an action of care for others and the world that God so loves.

Generosity...it's a Jesus thing!

“As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.” -1 Timothy 1.17-19

What is Catechesis?

Catechesis is an ancient word that refers back to the process of learning the Christian faith. This process was rarely done alone, but rather with others seeking to learn and grow together. **Catechesis connects us to how the early church gathered. They would share a meal called the Agape Feast and then learn more of what it means to follow Jesus.** United Church of Christ congregations gather for Catechesis, a 7-week event that includes a meal, a youth track, and 2 adult tracks and Child care.



Neighbors in Need (NIN) Offering "Love of Children"

This year's theme is "Love of Children". Neighbors in Need (NIN) offering for 2019 supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States and territories. One third of NIN funds support the

Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities.

These grants fund projects, whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy, is to address systemic injustice. This year's offering will consider projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities.

St. John will receive NIN offering on World Communion Sunday October 6, 2019. If each individual members or non-members gave \$10, St. John could achieve the goal of \$1,000 or more.
